
























I watched the video and noticed a lot of questions which I wish I could answer. But, unfortunately there's not enough space to answer them all





We like to inspire food for thought.












LYPO (Love Your Perfect Opposite) has been created because we believe you learn the most about yourself by talking to people who are different than you and who disagree with you.








COUSCOUS AT PALLAB

The Couscous Global Lab brings together a group of young people, including artists and policymakers, living in the UK, with a non-British heritage. They will work with leading European artists and senior youth policymakers from the UK and The Netherlands in an experimental Lab to invent creative forms of debating around 'cool politics' and finding their 'opposites' from 'difficult" countries.

PAL has invited the Dutch filmmaker Maartje Nevejan to be the Lab Director. She will be developing her seven year experience of working with groups of multicultural young people, which first started in a high school in Amsterdam a year after 9/11.

Amongst the participants in the lab (june 2009) were some of the young artists we met in Iran and China.

Dancers, actors, policymakers, journalists, poets, filmmakers, musicians and hip hop artistsfrom ~Muslim, Christian, Atheist, Communist backgrounds.

A dvd is in the making and several new productions/ festivals will take place in the coming years.

PAL has a 20-year track record for producing unique experimental cross-disciplinary residential Labs, attracting exceptional talents across the arts and sciences, in education, research and policymaking and in the creative development of high-quality content for the networked society. (www.pallabs.org)

Started in june 2008, with building the site.

8-8-2008 THE SITE WAS ON-LINE.

We made no publicity and steadily grew in size and visitors. We uploaded our video's on YouTube, Daily Motion & Vimeo and embedded these movies on our own site www.couscousglobal.com and on Facebook/Hvves/Bebo/ Myspace/Linkedin.

Hundreds of other sites embedded our movies or grabbed them and put them on their own sites.

We were Creative Commons so that was OK with us.

On a regular basis our movies were put on:

the Chinese Danwei, the American Monthly Review and the Images and Voices of Hope websites.

WITHIN THESE 10 MONTHS:

we travelled ourselves to 5 countries

17 countries participated and made movies for us: AGHANISTAN, AZERBAIJAN, CAMBODJA, CHINA, GAZA, HOLLAND, IRAN, IRAQ, ISRAEL, KENYA, NORWAY, SINGAPORE, SOUTH AFRICA, SURINAME, TANZANIA, UNITED KINGDOM and USA.

Together we made 263 movies.

The movies were put on Youtube and watched on many websites and social networks. They attracted more than 1.000.000 viewers.
